Macroinvertebrates

We can tell how healthy the Anglesea Estuary is by the amount and diversity of the macroinvertebrates that we find. Sometimes there are lots, sometimes not so many. Let's see what we can find today!



Special points of interest:

- Lots of native animal, bird and fish species rely on the Anglesea Estuary to provide shelter, food and breeding spaces.
- When the water system is healthy, lots of these macro-invertebrates are found.
